Situational Analysis

We are currently working on our Situational Analysis, a document to help us use educational research against a deep analysis of our school to inform our future planning, our Strategic Improvement Plan for 2021-2024. Mrs Collie helped us during the week by ringing two families from each class to seek feedback on what families love about our school and what you think we could be doing even better. The themes were clear with many families showing concern for the safety of our students outside our school with dangerous driving and illegal parking causing distress for the whole community. As a result, I will again seek support form Liverpool Council to seek a Lollypop worker to assist our students to cross the road safely at the pedestrian crossing. In 2017 the Council came out and analysed our traffic and explained we didn't have enough traffic to warrant this service. Now with the addition of the traffic from the workers from Mainsbridge School, I am hoping we may be entitled to this service.

Further, our families shared a need to move towards more electronic information. As a result we are currently investigating online newsletter services. We will keep you in the loop as we progress with these initiatives. Thank you to the families who participated in these phone calls as we truly appreciate your ideas and support.

Library Upgrade

We are currently in the process of upgrading our Library. Yesterday we ordered new furniture for a modern future focussed and flexible approach to the room. We are so lucky that our Library is a very large space filled with outstanding reading resources and we want to capitalise on the space to further enhance the learning experiences for our students. We are hoping this project will be ready for the beginning of 2021.

We want to offer families more flexibility with their work commitments and child care arrangements and to create more opportunities across the whole community. Having Out of School Hours Care available at local schools is a great way to achieve this.

As part of the NSW Government's \$120 million Before and After School Care (BASC) commitment, parents at all NSW schools were recently invited to complete a Have Your Say survey. The survey results have helped us to better understand the needs of families and what's important to them.


We are now asking all parents to complete a <u>quick follow-up survey</u> by Friday 27th November 2020. You can access the survey at



School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apoly</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.
